

BUTLER HIGH GYMNASTICS LEGEND HAS IT THAT JIM CURZI WAS THE GREATEST ALL-AROUND GYMNAST **COACHED AND DEVELOPED BY COACH URAM. MICKEY URAM** WAS A CLOSE SECOND AND EQUALLY **WORTHY OF BHS LEGENDARY STATUS. MICKEY WAS** AN OUTSTANDING ALL-AROUND GYMNAST WHO WAS A FOUR YEAR LETTERMAN FROM 1964 TO 1967. **MICKEY WAS THIRD HIGHEST SCORER ON THE BHS** TEAM AS A FRESHMAN, SECOND AS A SOPHOMORE, AND FIRST AS BOTH A JUNIOR AND SENIOR. **MICKEY WAS THIRD IN THE WPIGL ALL-AROUND** AS A FRESHMAN, SECOND AS A SOPHOMORE, AND FIRST AS BOTH A JUNIOR AND SENIOR. IN THE PENN STATE SPONSORED PENNSYLVANIA STATE MEETS OF THOSE YEARS, MICKEY WAS FIFTH AS A FRESHMAN, THIRD AS A SOPHOMORE, SECOND AS A JUNIOR, AND FIRST AS A SENIOR. **DURING HIS FOUR YEARS AS A BUTLER HIGH VARSITY GYMNAST, MICKEY EARNED MANY WPIGL AND** PENNSYLVANIA STATE MEDALS AND CHAMPIONSHIPS, WITH THE HIGHLIGHT BEING HIS PENNSYLVANIA STATE CHAMPIONSHIP IN THE ALL-AROUND.

LIKE CURZI BEFORE HIM, MICKEY WAS STRONG ON ALL SIX EVENTS. EQUALLY ADEPT AT THE DIFFICULT POMMEL HORSE, THE STRENGTH DEMANDING STILL RINGS, AND THE RISKY SKILLS OF THE HIGH BAR, MICKEY WAS ALSO A STRONG TUMBLER AND AN ARTISTIC FLOOR EXERCISE PERFORMER, A DYNAMIC VAULTER, AND AN IMPRESSIVE PARALLEL BAR WORKER. NOT ONLY WAS MICKEY A WELL-BALANCED ALL-AROUND GYMNAST, BUT HE WAS CREATIVE, ACCEPTED NEW LEARNING CHALLENGES, AND PERFORMED DIFFICULT SKILLS NOT PREVIOUSLY ACHIEVED BY ANY BHS GYMNAST.

WELL RESPECTED BY HIS TEAMMATES, MICKEY WAS A TEAM CAPTAIN, A MOST VALUABLE PLAYER, AND WINNER OF THE PRESTIGIOUS SPARTAN AWARD AS BHS' BEST ATHLETE.

HIGHLY RECRUITED BY NCAA DIVISION ONE GYMNASTICS
TEAMS, MICKEY FINALLY SETTLED ON MICHIGAN STATE
UNIVERSITY, FOLLOWING CURZI'S LEAD. LIKE CURZI,
MICKEY WENT ON TO A STELLAR CAREER AT MSU,
EARNING THREE VARSITY LETTERS, AND MISSING A FOURTH
DUE TO A SEASON CUT SHORT BY A SERIOUS INJURY.

MICKEY HAD A DISTINGUISHED CAREER AS A MSU TEAM
MEMBER AND HIGH SCORER, AS A COMPETITOR IN OPEN
INVITATIONALS, BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS, AND
NCAA DIVISION ONE CHAMPIONSHIPS.

TEAM LEADER ON FOUR UNDEFEATED BUTLER HIGH
GYMNASTICS TEAMS.

HIS STRONG ALL-AROUND PERFORMANCES MADE MICKEY THE CENTRAL FIGURE ON THE TEAM WHICH PRODUCED COACH URAM'S ONE HUNDREDTH WIN (AND UNDEFEATED), A FEAT NEVER ACHIEVED BEFORE IN PENNSYLVANIA GYMNASTICS HISTORY.










Coach Uram Steers Butler High Gymnasts to Undefeated Season
















































MICKEY URAM IS A LIFE-LONG RESIDENT OF BUTLER.
